Day at Big Brook Dam Dam Hike, Raft Building and Canoeing (year 5+) 6+-hour session Bus required **Stand-up paddleboards can be introduced for year 7+	Visit the beautiful regrowth forest of Big Brook Dam - now 60 years old. It provides pure water, animal habitats, and timber and echoes and mirrors the grand backdrop which once appeared in the area prior to forestry. Participants travel 10 minutes by bus to the Dam for a day of raft building, canoeing, and bushwalking (4km sealed). Team/beach games can be added to facilitate a 4th rotation. A bushwalk to the dam from Pemberton camp school can also be arranged in place of a bus one way, but it's approximately 2hrs walk or 1.5hr by bike which may need to be pushed uphill and not for novice riders. **Stand-up paddleboarding is an option for older participants in place of canoeing	\$70	
Yeagarup Adventure Recommend for year 5+ 3-hour session each Bus required Access is not wheelchair friendly due to boggy sand and slopes	A 50-minute drive from Pemberton, the Yeagarup Dunes are the largest land-locked mobile dune system in the southern hemisphere. Participants will hike in from Lake Yeagarup followed by a support vehicle. They will run down the Dunes playing games and learn about the local area and environment. This activity can accommodate multiple groups.	\$38	
Canoeing Recommend for year 5+ 3-hour session Bus required if requesting Dam location	Join us on the water for a combination of skill sessions and instructional games on 2 and 3-person canoes, followed by a paddle around the Pemberton Pool. Participants will gain water confidence, paddling, balance skills, and teamwork. Option for Big Brook Dam half-day paddle is available where bus transport is required.
